The first online kick-off meeting of the FORMER project

We held our first online kick-off meeting within the framework of the FORMER - Formation of Migrants in the Entrepreneurial Reality project, supported by the ES National Agency under the Erasmus+ Program, which took place on Friday 03/06/2022.

The FORMER project, which is attended by 5 partners (IGEA, GRIIO, IKIGAI, LLD AND VAEV) from TR, ES, AT and DE countries, aims to develop 8 needs research to increase the employment of young migrants. This project will serve at the same time to disseminate the Formation of Migrants across Europe. The target group of the project is young migrants who are living all around the world.

FORMER aims to increase the employment of migrants by offering training courses to help and provide them with access to information, orientation and counseling for setting up their own business. The common goal of all partners is to increase the employment of young migrants by opening new horizons, i.e. starting their own firm.

The project's overall objectives are to gain better insights on the barriers migrants face when wanting to become self-employed, collect all the knowledge migrants need when setting up their own business, and provide youth migrants with tailor-made learning courses to strengthen their entrepreneurial knowledge and skills. Our project offers a great opportunity to develop a lifetime partnership between TR, ES, AT and DE and to transfer good practices and innovation in the field of youth migrants.

Ability of Immigrants to Work in Another Country: Turkey

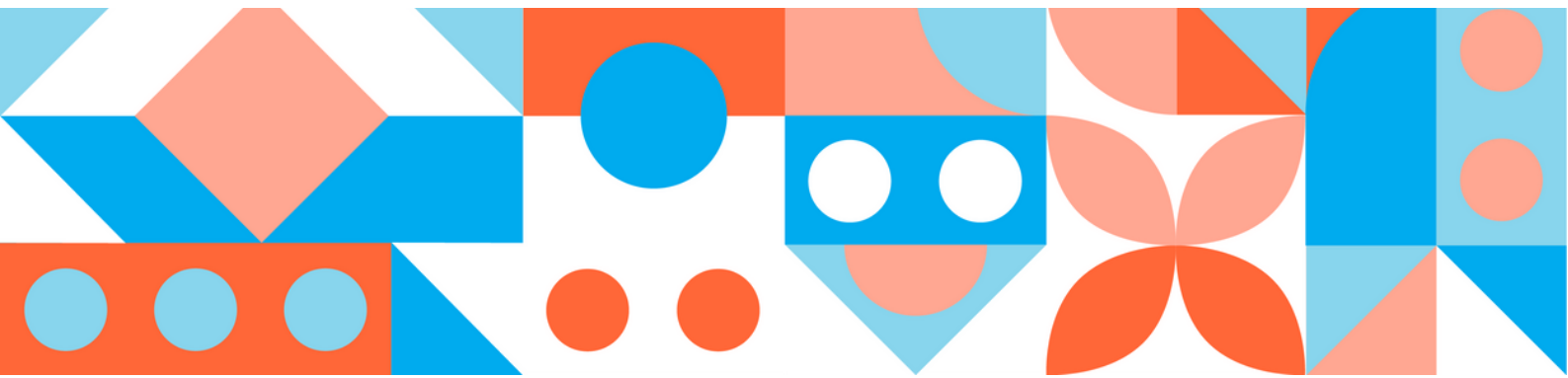
In the most general sense, migration or migration movement is defined as "change of settlements between well-defined geographical regions or administrative areas" Migration and migrant movements, which are as old as human history, continue to increase today. The first migrations of history, which emerged from the need to find food, remain current in the twenty-first century depending on physical, political, historical, military and socio-economic, cultural and environmental factors.

In order to obtain work permits to be given to immigrants of different status in Turkey, certain amounts of payment must be made by employers.

It is not possible for a foreign natural person to establish a sole proprietorship without a work permit. Residence permit alone is not sufficient, therefore, a sole proprietorship can be established after a 5-year residence permit and a work permit application. One of the important issues is that if the foreigner is applying for a work permit to practice self-employment, it is one of the conditions that the business they want to establish / establish has a positive impact on Turkey's economy, and it is a very open regulation.

The person who wants to work in Turkey as an employee or employer must obtain a work permit duly. As with different types of work permits, they also differ according to sectors and investments made. However, for instance, work permits to be obtained within the scope of foreign direct investments are very different from this procedure.
